
# Keypad Hardware and Software Update

During February 2005, all 630F, 690, 690F, 790, 790F Security Command<sup>™</sup> Keypads and 793 Easy Entry<sup>™</sup> Keypads will be manufactured with updated Level 'E' hardware. The New 693 Easy Entry <sup>™</sup> Keypad also features this update.

## Version 301 Software Update

In tandem with the hardware update, commencing February 2005, all 630F, 690, 690F, 790, 790F Security Command<sup>™</sup> keypads and 693, 793 Easy Entry<sup>™</sup> keypads are being manufactured with the new version 301 (10/25/04) software, previously version 200 (11/30/04).

## Version 301 Features

## 7/0 Panic Keys

The Security Command<sup>™</sup> and Easy Entry<sup>™</sup> keypads using version 301 software will allow the user to initiate an optional Panic alarm by pressing the 7 and 0 (zero) keys simultaneously for one-half (1/2) second. When pressed, a zone short message is automatically sent to the panel for the first zone of the keypad address. Two seconds later a zone restore message is sent to the panel. Typically, the associated zone programmed in the panel would be a Panic type (PN).

7/0 PANIC 7/ ENABLE: NO YES Use

#### 7/0 Panic

Use this option to configure the 7 and 0 keys as a 2-button panic feature. To enable the 7/0 Panic, select YES. To disable the option, select NO. Default is NO. (Refer to the Panic Key Options section in the LT-0836 Keypad Installation.)
